



Teen Mentor Day Camp Behavioral Contract

As a volunteer Caddie at Roseville Girl Scout Day Camp you are a role model for all participants. In order to ensure a positive experience for you, other volunteers and campers, we ask that you review and agree to the following behavior expectations.

- **Be a team player:** You are part of a unit and will be working with adult volunteers, campers, and other caddies. Your participation is necessary for a great week!
- **Be respectful:** It takes many people working together to make day camp run smoothly. You will be asked to do a variety of tasks, some of which may not be as fun as others. Regardless of what your role is or what you are asked to do, please do it in a manner reflective of the Girl Scout Promise and Girl Scout Law. Drawing on yourself, rumors, gossiping, harassing or degrading will not be tolerated.
- Ask questions: We all have times when we don't understand things we're asked to do; if you don't
 understand something, please ask.
- Dress appropriately: Wear the day camp shirt provided along with clean, appropriate length shorts or pants. As an example for the campers, wear only closed-toe shoes each day. Non-revealing clothing is most appropriate, including one-piece swimming suits.
- **Use appropriate language:** The age of our campers is 6-12 years old. Saying something inappropriate can be just as bad as doing it. If you don't know if you should be having the conversation, you probably shouldn't be! Our language must reflect the Girl Scout Promise and Girl Scout Law at *all times*.
- **Do your job:** You are expected to help in the unit by leading kapers, songs, games, and assisting with the unit activities. It is your responsibility to take initiative when leading activities, making sure not just one or two caddies are getting the brunt of the work. Additionally, you are also responsible for choosing songs/games that are age appropriate for the campers.
- **Follow the basic rules of camp:** As a role model and volunteer, you are expected to follow all the camp expectations and rules.
- Have a positive attitude: Campers are excited to be at day camp, and they will focus on you.
 Throughout the week you'll need to be positive and upbeat. You are at day camp to have fun and volunteer. Let it show!

If I choose not to adhere to the above expectations, the following check-ins will occur:

First check-in: I will check-i expectations.	in with the Camp Director to discuss cond	erns, consequences and behavior
 Second check-in: If the behavior does not improve, I will check in with the Camp Director to address concerns and determine consequences and expectations. I understand at this point, my parent/guardian will be contacted to let them know what is happening. Third check-in: If I need to have a third check-in, it will be with the Camp Director and my parent/guardian. Depending on the outcome, I may be asked to leave day camp for the rest of the session.
